



AMENDMENT No.2 TO NOTICE OF RACE (Translation)

Read:

"6.1. Eligibility

- **6.1.1.** The Transat Jacques Vabre 2013 is open to multihulls and monohulls, which will be split into classes as follows:
 - IMOCA Class: Monohulls as defined in the IMOCA Class Rules,
 - Multi50 Class: Multihulls as defined in the Multi50 Class Rules,
 - Class40: Monohulls as defined in the Class40 Class Rules
 - MOD70 Class: Multihulls as defined in the MOD70 Class Rules 2012."

"Article 6.2. Entry fees are set at:

- 10,000 Euros ex-VAT for boats in the IMOCA Class + applicable VAT
- 5,500 Euros ex-VAT for boats in the Multi 50 Class + applicable VAT
- 4,500 Euros ex-VAT for boats in the Class40 monohulls + applicable VAT.
- 12,000 Euros ex-VAT for boats in the MOD70 Class + applicable VAT."

"16.2. The main trophies are:

1st MOD70 multihull: Trophée Jacques Vabre1st IMOCA monohull: Trophée Jacques Vabre1st MULTI 50 Class: Trophée Jacques Vabre1st Class40 monohull: Trophée Jacques Vabre

B. MODIFICATION TO NOTICE OF RACE

Paragraph 4.1 read

• The class rules 2013 for each eligible class, for the MOD70s, the class rules 2012 and any possible amendments

paragraph 5.2.1: Remove and replace the first paragraph with:

"5.2.1. Number: all boats must have a distinctive race number visible at all times on the deck, the hull(s) (except the IMOCAs and the Multi 50s) and the sails. The dimensions are detailed in the class rules for each Class."

Paragraph 5.2.5: Remove and replace with:

"5.2.5 Race logo: all boats entered shall sport the race logo on their mainsail. This logo shall be within a circle whose diameter is 3 metres for the MOD70 and IMOCA boats, a circle whose diameter is 2 metres for Multi50s, and a circle whose diameter is 1.50 metres for Class40 boats. The centre of this circle shall be positioned at one third mast height above the deck. Branding materials shall be supplied by the Organiser and it shall be the Skipper's responsibility to ensure they are correctly adhered until the end of the race. Any breach of this rule may incur a financial penalty for the guilty boat."

Paragraph 6.1.4 read :

"6.1.4. In order for a class to be eligible, a minimum of 5 boats must be entered before 12th July 2013. However, if a class is due to have under 5 boats at the close of registration on 12th July 2013, the organiser may decide to allow the boats already entered from the class in question to race.

Once registration is closed, the race organiser will confirm which classes are permitted to race based on the number of entries."

Paragraph 8. SCHEDULE, replace by

"8.1 LE HAVRE

Friday 25th October 1200hrs: Boats shall be at the disposal of the Race Organisation, in

the port of Le Havre, in the Bassin Paul Vatine, failing which they shall receive a financial penalty of no less than €1,000 for each 24-hour period of absence. However, the race organisation may grant dispensation on a case by case

basis, subject to a valid reason for this delay.

The Race Organisation will provide a mooring plan, which crews agree to adhere to. Boats are no longer allowed to leave the port without the crews receiving written authorisation from race management.

1800hrs: Welcome briefing for Skippers.

Saturday 26th October 0900hrs: Start of scrutineering,

0930hrs: Exhibition Regatta in Bénéteau 7.5s on the Bassin de l'Eure:

Elimination round

1800hrs: Public announcement of the day's results followed by the

Official crew presentation.

Sunday 27th October 1100hrs: Exhibition Regatta in Bénéteau 7.5s on the Bassin de l'Eure:

Final round

1700hrs: Exhibition Regatta prize-giving

Wednesday 30th October 1430hrs: Safety briefing for the skippers (presence of 2

skippers)

Thursday 31st October 1000hrs: meeting between children/skippers

"Friday 1st November 1000hrs: Start briefing reserved for the Skippers

1400hrs: Support RIB briefing

1800hrs: End of scrutineering: Boats which have not completed

inspections by this date shall not be permitted to start.

Deadline for registering the departure declaration.

1900hrs: Official evening reception to celebrate the 20th anniversary of

the Transat Jacques Vabre

Saturday 2 November 1430hrs: Briefing for accredited launches

1530hrs: Briefing for passenger boats

Sunday 3 November 0900hrs: Boats exit the port

1245hrs: Start of the prologue for the multihulls

1302hrs: Start of the Transat Jacques Vabre for the monohulls

Tuesday 5 November 1302hrs: Start of the multi50 (see NOR12.4 modified below)

Friday 8 November 1302hrs: Start of the MOD70s (see NOR12.4 modified below)

8.2 ITAJAÏ

Saturday 30th November Inshore race in Itajai, 1st prize-giving and official evening

reception (timetables to be detailed in the Sailing Instructions).

Saturday 7th or Sunday 8th December 2nd prize-giving and official evening (timetables to be

detailed in the Sailing Instructions)."

9. CREW REPRESENTATION OBLIGATIONS, replace 9.1 by :

"9.1. Mandatory attendance by the skipper and co-skipper:

9.1.1. In Paris: for the presentation press conference, which will take place on 8th October 2013.

9.1.2. In Le Havre:

- At each Skipper briefing described in this amendment to NOR article 8.
- From Friday 25th October 2013 at 1200 noon until Sunday 28th October 2013 at 1800 hours for the Exhibition Regatta
- On Saturday 26th October at 1800hrs for the official skippers' presentation
- From Wednesday 30th October 2013 from 1430 hours until the race start.
- Friday 1st November 2013 at 1900 hours at the official evening reception to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the Transat Jacques Vabre.

9.1.3. Itajaï:

- At the finish press conference
- At the prize-giving relating to each competitor's category. Failure to attend will result in no prize being awarded: 2 official prize-givings are scheduled in the finish port: 30th November 2013 for the competitors who make the finish within the deadline, and 7th or 8th December 2013 for the other competitors.
- At the promotional regatta organised in the finish port on 30th November 2013
- The boat shall remain in Itajaï in the berth designated to them until the day after their respective prize-giving at the latest.

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Paragraph 20.1 1st sentence

Read:

"20.1. All forms of navigational assistance are permitted, notably weather routing (modification to RRS 41) in the Multi50 and MOD70 Classes.

Weather routing is forbidden for IMOCA boats and Class40 boats

The race organisation reserves the right to study any specific request from a class on the subject of routing."

Read:

"12.4 There will be no additional marks for the multihulls

After the prologue, the multihulls will return to the Paul Vatine basin until their start day. They will remain in race configuration with outside assistance permitted.

The day of their start as defined in the present amendment, may be advanced or delayed according to weather conditions predicted along the entire course of the race; 48hrs prior to the start, routing will be carried out using the most relevant wind information provided by the race forecaster (METEO FRANCE), with the MOD70 polars and the Multi50 polars, polars having already proven their accuracy in previous races."
